<u>Spelling Words</u>

This will display our weekly spelling words. We will have our standard spelling list, a list of challenge words, and a bonus word. Spelling homework for the week will be on average 3 activities a week. I will supply a list of activities in the box

below.

Homework

Spelling

Students will choose 3 activities from a list to practice their spelling words. Activities can range from write a sentence for each of your spelling words, write your spelling words in alphabetical order, Magazine Words-cut out letters from magazines or newspapers to spell out your spelling words, or write your spelling words 3 times each in your favorite colored pen. These are just some examples of activities that you will see listed weekly. Students may also choose to work on Spelling City.com.

They have games, and practice tests, that can be turned in as a spelling activity.

Math

A math activity or one handout will be given each week.

<u>Science/Geography</u>

Students will have a Science Weekly Workout page, or a Weekly Geography page to work on.

Reading

 2^{nd} graders are required to read 20 minutes/5 days a week. Students should fill in book and minutes read in their reading log. Parents please initial.

<u>Reading/ELA</u>

We will be doing a lot of shared reading during this first week of school. Math

Students will compare objects, and determine how they are alike and different. We will also review combinations of 10, and patterns.

<u>History & Geography</u>

Science

We will begin to create our science journal. We will discuss what makes us a scientist, and begin recording our first observations in our science journals.
